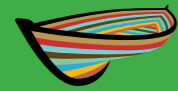

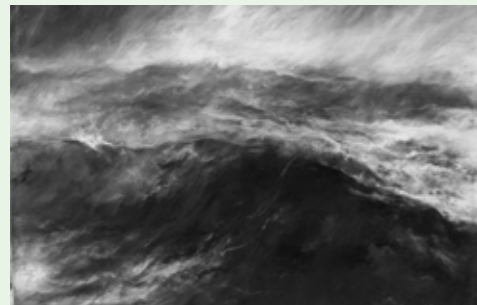
The exhibition will be complemented by two shows in the Lower Gallery:

Her large scale drawings and canvases are a direct response to the environment and the traditions inherent with it.
