

butterfly

You will need:

Old socks or shirt sleeves, needle and thread, glue, stuffing (fabric), fabric for wings, wing template, buttons and beads to decorate

- 1. Use sleeves or old socks to use to make the body of your butterfly. Secure the end by tying or sewing it shut.
- 2. Fill your butterfly with stuffing materials to make it nice and fat! Use old fabric, dried beans, or newspaper or a mixture of all three. Make sure you have space to close the other end. Use a strip of fabric to tie the body shut. Put lots of knots in the ends of the fabric to make antannae.
- 3. Use the butterfly wing template and to cut out shapes from fabric to make the wings. Make at least 16 shapes (4 for each wing section).
- 4. Sew together all the fabric for each wing section.
- 5. Sew these on to the body of your butterfly.
- 6. Decorate your butterfly. Add eyes, stripes and spots. Use different contrasting farbics to make patterns.

You could build a sculpture, paint a picture, write and record a song, make a film or anything else you can think of... there's no size restriction as long as it can fold up into a car! Just bring your submission to Mareel by September 1st. The brain will grow in the Tennis Court over the Big Takeover weekend.
