

## You will need:

Doughnut template, pencil, cardboard, scissors, tape, strips of fabric



## pom-pom flower

- Cut out the paper template, draw around it to make two doughnut rings out of cardboard, such as a cereal box. Cut these out.
- 2. Lay a piece of fabric on top of one of the doughnuts, so the ends stick out at the slit. Put the other doughnut on top so that the slits line up.
- 3. Get the end of a long strip of fabric and tie it around the doughnut.
- 4. Keep wrapping fabric around the doughnut. You can tie more fabric to the end of your strip if you run out.
- 5. Once you can't possibly fit any more fabric through the little hole inside the doughnut secure the end of the fabric strip.
- 6. Use scissors to cut around the pom-pom. You might need an adult to help you. Slide the scissors between the two cardboard doughnuts and begin cutting the fabric. Work all the way around the doughnut. Be careful to hold it tight. Use the piece of fabric between the doughnuts to secure the pom-pom. Pull it REALLY tight and tie it in a knot. Remove your carboard doughnuts slide them out of the pom-pom.

A YEAR OF YOUNG PEOPLE TAKEOVER...


